Examples of the types of information found on the [Resource Center](#) include:

- Assessment forms and checklists
- Informed care memorandums
- Regulatory and federal guidelines
- Sample clinical policies and procedures
- Survey management tools

The resources, tools, and information available focus on all care levels of senior housing and can be used by administrators/executive directors, directors of nursing/resident care coordinators, facilities management, and others in the organization.

Many of the resources and tools on the [Resource Center](#) are user-friendly Word documents that may be downloaded, customized, and used within an organization immediately.

The [Pendulum Risk Management Resource Center for Senior Housing](#) is updated regularly to ensure subscribers are viewing current information on issues and trends in the healthcare setting. Users can see at a glance what recent resources have been uploaded in the “What’s New” column on the Resources page.

eAssist™ allows a subscriber to ask a clinician a question regarding any area of risk management in the healthcare setting and receive a direct response. Frequently asked questions (FAQs) are also a reference for users.

Users receive monthly informational emails on important risk management topics with links to corresponding resources.

The My Docs page is a custom list users create to access favorite and frequently used resources. This is done by simply checking a box within the resource description. When a particular resource is no longer needed, the user can delete the resource on the My Docs page—without deleting it from the Resource Center.



The [Resource Center](#) also allows subscribers to follow the status of key healthcare legislation. Users can see when a bill was introduced, the bill’s sponsor, status details, and any current action on the bill, as well as news and blog coverage of the bill.

An annual subscription to the [Resource Center](#) includes unlimited users within a single organization.

Subject/Title: 1.4 Facility-based Risk Management Plan

I. Introduction

The Facility-based Risk Management Plan takes the defined components of the Corporate Risk Management Plan and establishes policies and procedures that can be used by all levels of employees to meet the goals of the corporate program. An initial step for the facility to take is to evaluate current practices that may be incorporated into the Facility-based Risk Management Plan.

Topics to be addressed in the facility-based plan include:

1. Purpose of the Risk Management Plan defining how the plan supports the organization's mission and vision for a proactive process to manage clinical risk and resident safety and operational, business, legal, regulatory, technology, human capital, hazard, and strategic risk
2. Scope of the Plan addressing program services, culture of safety, just culture, and proactive risk identification through the lens of enterprise risk management
3. Risk Management Program Goals including processes for risk identification, risk analysis, risk-reduction and prevention strategies, risk controls, and creating a culture of safety
4. Administrative leadership and Risk Management Committee responsibilities
5. Collaboration between Quality Assurance and Process Improvement and Risk Management activities to clearly define types of data collected, trended, and reported and the review processes for prepared data
